2022 - SECOND QUARTER REPORT

ALL LOCAL UNIONS SYSTEM COUNCIL NO. 2

Dear Brothers and Sisters:

In June 2022, the Railroad Retirement Board (RRB) submitted its financial reports on the railroad retirement and railroad unemployment insurance systems. As of September 30, 2021, the total railroad retirement assets managed by the National Railroad Retirement Investment Trust and the railroad retirement system accounts at the Treasury, equaled \$30.4 billion. The cash balance of the railroad unemployment insurance system was \$50.6 million at the end of fiscal year 2021. The RRB concluded in the report that, barring a sudden, unanticipated, large decrease in railroad employment or substantial investment losses, the railroad retirement system will experience no cashflow problems during the next 25 years under any employment assumption. The RRB did not recommend any change in the rate of tax imposed by current law on employers and employees in the report.

The Coordinated Bargaining Coalition (CBC) released a statement on June 15, 2022, advising that following the conclusion of the third straight week of compulsory mediation conducted by the National Mediation Board (NMB), the CBC and the Brotherhood of Maintenance of Way/SMART Mechanical Coalition pursuant to Section 5 First of the Railway Labor Act, received a proffer of arbitration from the NMB. If either party rejects the NMB's proffer or fails to respond prior to the deadline of 5:00 p.m. (EDT) on June 16, 2022, the parties will enter a 30-day "cooling off" period where the status quo is maintained. While each Rail Union has its own process for considering whether or not to accept the NMB's proffer, it is anticipated that the Unions will unanimously reject it. At any point during the 30-day cooling off period, President Biden may appoint a Presidential Emergence Board (PEB), which typically consists of three to five members. The PEB will conduct a hearing and issue a recommendation regarding settlement of the dispute. The issuance of the PEB recommendation starts another 30-day cooling off period. During the second cooling off period, the parties may choose to accept or reject the PEB's recommendation. If either party rejects, or if the cooling off period expires and the dispute

has not been resolved, either party may engage in self-help. If this happens, it is expected that Congress will intervene and end self-help by passing legislation to resolve the dispute.
